TODAY'S READING

Let us prepare ourselves for the Word of God. Our hearts and minds are open and we are eager to hear.

MESSAGE - Doubt, Denial and Unbelief

Last week I started my message with the observation that for over 2,000 years people have been writing books and preaching on the many aspects regarding the suffering of the crucifixion, and celebration of the resurrection of our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ.

In God's word, the writings of three major events in the life of Jesus Christ have brought about love, joy, peace and hope to those of us who believe. By the same token millions of people around the world who have heard and read about these events have walked away with doubt, denial, unbelief and rejection.

Let's take a closer look at these three events. Seven hundred (700) years before Jesus was born, the prophet Micah prophesied this: "But you Bethlehem Ephrata, though you are small among the clans of Judah, out of you will come for me one who will be ruler over Israel, whose origins are from of old, from ancient times." (Micah 5:2).

So, for hundreds of years this prophecy, along with many others, was passed down from generation to generation. Over the centuries a remnant of the Jewish people continued to believe that their king, the messiah, was coming to the earth and would be born in Bethlehem.

The birth of Jesus is the first of three major events that would take place with Jesus Christ on earth. God had set into motion all things He had planned for

in this fullness of time. Jesus came to earth with no public fanfare, but rather in a humble manner, as was arranged by God.

At that time a small number of people were made aware of His birth and came to worship the new born King. However, many Jewish people were expecting the Messiah to bring about their deliverance from the Roman bondage and restore the earthly kingdom of Israel. God's plan for Jesus would turn out to be in stark contrast to their expectations.

Today we know that many Jewish people doubt, deny, disbelieve and totally reject Jesus Christ of Nazareth as the promised King and deliverer they had expected. Some are still awaiting His first appearance.

The second major event was Jesus' Crucifixion, and Resurrection three days later. Many turned against Him and doubted, denied and did not believe He was who He said He was. Even Jesus' followers had their doubts that He would come back, after seeing Him crucified. Even when Mary told them she had just seen Jesus, some still doubted. Thomas, of course, was one we all remember.

Jesus said "I am the first and the last. I am He that lives, and was dead; and behold I am forevermore, amen; and have the keys of hell and death." (Rev. 1:17-18). "I and my Father are one." (Jn. 10:30). "Don't you know me, Phillip, even after I have been among you such a long time? Anyone who has seen me has seen the Father. How can you say, 'Show us the Father?' " (Jn.14:9). "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me." (Jn. 14:6).

So right before Jesus was to be crucified, He began to tell His disciples of the third major event which was coming to take place on planet earth. He was coming back! He began to teach them some of the details which would surround His return.

Jesus said, "For as lightning comes from the east and flashes to the west, so also will the coming of the Son of Man be." (Matt, 24:27). "But of that day and hour no one knows, not even the angels of heaven, but my Father only." (Matt, 24:36).

Several years ago there was supposedly a true story told about a preacher who told his congregation that the following week he was going to tell them when Jesus would be returning. They laughed and he said that he was serious. He knew when Jesus was coming back and that he would tell them the next week. He also told them to bring their friends and their neighbors and that they would also learn when Jesus was coming back.

So the story goes that the following week it was hard to seat everyone who came. People were packed in the pews and some standing at the back of the church. He gave his whole sermon and people were hanging onto his every word. At the end of his message, he told them that at that moment he was going to tell them when Jesus would return. You could hear a pin drop. People leaned forward to hear better. He said, "Jesus is coming back...at a time when you least expect Him", and then said his closing prayer.

Jesus continued His instructive, warning message. "But as the days of Noah were, so also will the coming of the Son of Man be. For as in the days before the flood, they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage until the day that Noah entered the ark, and did not know until the flood came, and took them all away, so also will the coming of the Son of Man be." (Matt. 24:37-39).

Years ago, Carmen and I visited Oral Roberts University in Tulsa, Oklahoma. My parents had moved there to do volunteer work for the church, university, prayer tower, hospital, etc. At that time, a huge Noah's ark was built, with a reenactment of the day of the flood. We went up the gangplank into the ark and were seated. After everyone was in, the huge door closed. A few minutes went by and then we heard raindrops on the roof, and then a downpour. Thunder could be heard and lightning could be seen through the small windows at the top. You could hear the wind and the storm building in intensity. All of a sudden we heard screaming and shouting outside the door. People were pounding on it and yelling for help. It was so real that we wanted to help them and could actually imagine what it must have been like to be left behind... to drown. The floor began to sway and it felt like we were in a boat. Gradually we heard the shouting and banging on the door go silent. We still heard the storm for a few minutes and then it was over. I was totally impressed and never forgot it.

Jesus went on, "Watch therefore, for you do not know what hour your Lord is coming. But know this, that if the master of the house had known what hour the thief would come, he would have watched and not allowed his house to be broken into, therefore you also be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect." (Matt. 24: 42-44).

People, we do know when Jesus is coming back...at a time that we least expect. It could be today. Why not? Are we ready today for Jesus to return? Do we need to ask God right now to forgive us for any secret sins we might be harboring. God knows that even as Christians, we will continue to sin, because of our sinful nature. He already knows about them anyway, but He wants us

to acknowledge and repent of our sins. He wants us to be pleasing to Him and God does not wink at sin. He says, "If we will confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness." (1 Jn. 1:9). We need to turn away from any sin in our lives and strive to not revisit those sins.

People will say, "Well, my Great Granddaddy and my Granddaddy and my Daddy all believed that He was coming back in their time on earth. So why should I believe He's coming back in my lifetime?" Well, we are closer to the time of His coming than our relatives from several generations in the past. Further, He wants us to be obedient to what He's teaching His disciples, to remember His warnings to them. He wants us to keep alive the blessed hope that He has given us, to be looking and longing for His return. If you get a chance, pick up a book by David Jeremiah, called <u>Discover Paradise</u>, <u>A</u> <u>Guidebook to Heaven</u>, <u>Your True Home</u>. I think it's excellent.

So, today, on this glorious day, we celebrate three things...the first, that Jesus was born in the manger in Bethlehem, fulfilling God's promise made in the Old Testament. The second that Jesus DID rise from the dead and is ALIVE IN OUR HEARTS TODAY! HALLELUJAH! Thank you, God, for your promise fulfilled! And thirdly, that we still look forward to His promised second coming, to take us home. We have so much for which to be thankful on this Easter Sunday morning!

Several years ago I ran onto a Dottie Rambo song that has a message that I feel strikes a chord with me. It's called,

"I've Never Been This Homesick Before"
