



We owe a debt of gratitude to all those who have contributed their time, talents, and materials towards this effort. Here's a partial list of cemetery happenings this spring:

- Cemetery Board President, David Thomas, made arrangements with Chris Roop to have new gravel delivered for the existing driveway and to create a new driveway in the north section. In an amazing charitable blessing, Chris Roop donated his time, hauling, and the gravel (at no expense to the cemetery!) in memory of his grandparents, Ernest and Mary Zoller. Thank you to Chris Roop for this special memorial gift that will be utilized and enjoyed by many for years to come!
- The cemetery fence rows are in the process of being trimmed back and brush removed. Since we had a large amount of rain this week, the cemetery work day has been rescheduled to Saturday, May 4th at 9:00 a.m. to finish the cleanup. Thank you in advance to everyone that will be helping with this project. Special thanks to Danny Hutter and David Rauch for already working several Saturdays and getting the project underway.



#### Mothers in the Bible

The role that mothers played in the biblical story is undeniable. From the beginning pages of Genesis to the latter letters of Timothy, the influence of mothers (both good and bad) is seen time and time again. The impact that the mother has on the child can and will have everlasting consequences (2 Timothy 3:15). The godly mother will pass on a genuine faith to her children just as Timothy's mother, Eunice did for him (2 Timothy 1:5). Here's a small sample of the mothers found in the Bible:

- Eve was the "mother of all living" (Genesis 3:20)
- Sarah became a mother in her old age (Genesis 21:7)
- Rebekah preferred one son over the other (Genesis 27:5-10)
- Jochebed hid her son from harm for 3 months (Exodus 2:1-3)
- Hannah dedicated her son to the Lord (1 Samuel 1:22)
- Elizabeth's son prepared people for the Lord (Luke 1:13-17)
- Mary watched her Son be crucified for the world's sin (John 19:26)

### I am with you always

The Ascension of Christ is celebrated 40 days after Easter. It focuses upon the ascent of Christ into heaven shortly before Pentecost.

The Ascension is important to Christians because it reminds us that while Christ's human body could not be present everywhere, Christ's spiritual presence can be experienced universally. St. Matthew's Gospel tells us Christ's last words to his friends were, "Remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age" (Matthew 28:20 NRSV). And so Christ is!

**Christian Symbol: GREEN** — Green is the traditional liturgical color for the weeks after Pentecost (as well as the season of Epiphany). The Pentecost season largely overlaps with spring and summer, which is fitting because green symbolizes growth: growth of plant life and crops, and growth of the church in discipleship and faith.
