



## <u>Church Siding/Renovation</u> <u>Project Update</u>

The church siding project is complete! Many thanks to project leaders David Hampton and David Rauch and to the many others who have contributed their time and talents to the completion of this project. The church looks fantastic! Of note, some of the architectural features of the bell tower have

been restored. The corbels on the bell tower (green, decorative pieces under the eaves) were recreated and milled by Mark Schultz and David Rauch as the old corbels (under the previous siding) had decayed beyond use. In addition, the scalloped siding



on the bell tower provides a beautiful accent. Once the lightning rods have been installed, a large gold cross will be placed at the top of the tower.


