Mission Update from Paul/Jen Schaefer August 2022

Dear friends.

Thank you for praying for us over the last month. We are making good progress on the preparations for our departure back to Ghana on the 24th (Wednesday).

We appreciate your ongoing prayers and support as we prepare for travel, transition back to Ghana and hit the ground running.

Translation

We are thankful that Nicholas, Elisha and Stanley have been able to continue to work through corrections on *Genesis*.

But because the rains have been a bit erratic this year, whenever the rain came over this last month, they had to take some time off from translation work to do more work on their farms. Please pray for their farms and for a good harvest in spite of so many obstacles this year.

Also, we are thankful that Nicholas, as a translation consultant-in-training, has been helping again with the checking of the book of *Daniel* for the Birifor translation team.

Literacy

Eden and Samua have still been training and guiding the young volunteer teachers in training. The volunteer teachers who are studying to become full teachers have been on break over the last few weeks and will resume their teacher-training classes around the beginning of September. Please pray for ongoing strength and patience for Eden and Samua as they teach the young volunteer teachers.

You may remember that one of older teachers and translation reviewers, Mr. E.K. Yakubu, had been helping Eden to oversee the Tangayiri school. **We sadly got word of E.K.'s passing** just a couple weeks ago. (see picture below of EK Yakubu in Tangayiri)


Other Events

Just a couple weeks after we arrive back in Ghana, in early September, Paul will be running another grammar and discourse workshop in Tamale for the consultants in training. This will be a two week workshop, similar to the ones he held back in 2017 and 2019 but building on what they learned in those previous workshops. Please pray for Paul as he prepares for the workshop and for the consultants in training as they try to clear their schedule for this time away and for their ability to be able to concentrate and study well during this intensive time.

Also as we slowly get closer to finishing and printing the Safaliba NT with OT portions, we will need a place to store the bibles once they are printed, so Eden and others have begun making bricks in order to make a room for book storage. We are thankful for their progress so far on making bricks for the book storage room. (see pictures at right)

And on a very sad note, we got a phone call a couple weeks ago from Sammy informing us that **Pastor Jacob Sumani suddenly and unexpectedly passed away.** He is the Safaliba/Vagla pastor in Sawla who has helped us do translation checking and reviewing from time to time. He was not old (maybe early 40s) and leaves behind a wife and kids. He was doing a great job of outreach, evangelism and discipleship among the Vagla, Birifor and Safaliba in the town of Sawla, just 30 minutes north of Bole where we stay. **Please pray for his family and for the church he leaves behind.** (see pictures below)

Jacob completed Bible School in November of 2018 and began by helping his church members learn to read and getting them Bibles in their own language. He will be greatly missed!

Please keep us (Paul, Jen and Sarah) in your prayers as we get transitioned back to life in Ghana and pray for God's help with the many details we will need to take care of immediately after we land in order to get things up and running again. Also, pray for extra funds as well to cover all the initial costs of our return--getting our paperwork done, the truck up and running (inspection, renewal fees, insurance, etc.) and all the unexpected costs that often occur after a time away.

We are so thankful for additional gifts that came in last month which helped cover some of our flights, the room in Accra when we land and other essential items we need to take with us.

Thank you so much for your ongoing prayers for all of us and the project! We appreciate your prayers as we finish the final preparations for our departure. Please pray for all the details we will need to take care of as soon we get back to Ghana in addition to the preparations that will need to be made for the workshop in September.


