A READING FROM GOD'S WORD: 2 Peter 3:9

"The Lord is not slow to fulfill His promise as some count slowness, but is patient toward You, not wishing that any should perish, but that all should reach repentance."

MESSAGE:

THE FRUIT OF THE SPIRIT IS PATIENCE

"God wants to grow us up spiritually so that every action of our lives will be a portrait of Jesus." Paul G. Trulin.

Why is impatience such a problem for people? God certainly teaches us in His Word the importance of being patient. In the Greek the word patience is a compound word made up of two other words. Hypo, a word meaning under and moneo which means to abide or remain. So remain under is the idea as we go through difficult situations, when it is not wise or possible to

escape or avoid them. It means to bear up courageously under some degree of suffering. To be patient is to endure discomfort, waiting without complaint.

Ecclesiastes 7:9 – Do not be quickly provoked in your spirit, for anger resides in the lap of fools.

Ephesians 4:2 – Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love.

Romans 12:12 – Be joyful in hope, patient in affliction, faithful in prayer.

Psalms 37:7-9 – Be still before the Lord and wait patiently for Him; do not fret when people succeed in their ways, when they carry out their wicked schemes. Refrain from anger and turn from wrath; do not fret—it leads only to evil. For those who are evil will be destroyed, but those who hope in the Lord will inherit the land.

2 Thessalonians 1:4 – Therefore, among God's churches we boast about your perseverance and faith in all the persecutions and trials you are enduring.

Romans 5:1-5 -- Therefore being justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ: By whom also we have access by faith into this grace wherein we stand, and rejoice in hope of the glory of God. And not only so, but we glory in tribulations also: knowing that tribulation worketh patience; And patience, experience; and experience, hope: And hope maketh not ashamed; because the love of God is shed abroad in our hearts by the Holy Ghost which is given unto us.

1 Corinthians 13:4 – Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud.

Philippians 4:6 – Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God.

Proverbs 15:18 – A hot-tempered person stirs up conflict, but the one who is patient calms a quarrel.

In our world today, we are in the habit of getting things instantly with foods such as instant cereals, instant milk, coffee, indigestion relief, pain killers, whitened teeth, and many other things. We want everything... instantly. (Example...Lord give me patience and give it to me now.) We want convenience and service. Fast food, fast lines at the stores, fast lanes for our driving, etc. Right now we are all disappointed that we can't seem to get back to our jobs, our church, our restaurants, our stores, because of this virus. Disappointment is defined as unmet expectations. We expected to keep right on going the way we always have but instead, we are having to wait.

In James 1:2 it says, "Consider it pure joy, my brothers and sisters, whenever you face trials of many kinds, because you know that the testing of your faith produces patience." Just think of our own lives. Where are we weak in this area? Is it impatience with other people? How about in the line at Walmart, following drivers who are driving below the speed limit, impatient with our families, our older people? I believe we can identify and add other scenarios to those I just mentioned.

When our children were first driving I took our label maker... (Remember those?)... and made a label that said ICKY. I put it right on the dashboard of our cars by the odometer, because we all get impatient in traffic. But, the worst can be trying to get around someone on a two-lane highway and then taking chances by passing in a line of traffic or on a hill, without being sure the road is clear ahead. It could be like someone coming over the hill or pulling out of a side drive that we cannot see. ICKY means "Impatience Can Kill You."

I've learned that there are three basic types of patience:

- 1. Casual impatience: A dog barking in the night, a rainy day when you had a picnic planned, a football game where your team lost. These are just basic, daily irritations. We all go through them. We realize that life can be frustrating at times.
- Unexpected impatience: A flat tire on the highway, a temporary layoff at work, a fender bender. We knock over a glass of iced tea at our computer desk, ruining our computer. Being greatly inconvenienced and bored by being required to stay home from church, school, stores, etc. because of a worldwide pandemic. We know these things can happen.
- 3. Serious, life-changing ongoing impatience: A bedridden disease, pain that seems to never go away. A lifetime disability that constrains you from doing the normal things that others can easily do.

God wants to stretch us in our patience by allowing us to encounter situations where we need to wait. We're to wait on Him... to understand that things are not going to always go exactly or as quickly as we would like for them to. Look at us today. We are waiting, pausing, persevering, and tarrying, with no certainty as to how long this will last. Some have become tired of waiting and are moving out. Who am I to say whether they are correct in this or not? Our board has decided to wait patiently for another month to come to church together. This decision was not made lightly. Many things had to be taken into consideration as they deliberated on your behalf. This decision to wait was one they all had peace about.

I believe that God is at the point of our need. If it is urgent He will handle it as He feels it is required. If it is long term, He will be working behind the scenes to arrange people, places and things to coincide with His perfect timing required to bring it about. When we pray for something we know God is in, we must sit back and trust and thank Him for what He is doing. We do this in faith. We cannot see it yet but we know He is working to bring it about. He says that He has given each of us a measure of faith. He expects us to use it. He goes on to say without faith it is impossible to please Him. The apostle Paul had an ongoing pain in the flesh and asked God three times to heal Him and God said. "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness," Paul said, "Therefore I will boast all the more gladly about my weaknesses, so that Christ's power may rest on me."

I believe that we are and will continue to go through situations in the coming months and years that will be challenging for us. God wants us to learn to trust Him and to wait on Him, patiently listening for the still small voice of the Holy Spirit of God to lead us in the correct direction for every area of our lives. In other words, this pandemic may be the precursor of more weighty and

significant things to come in the future. We must learn to draw close and wait to hear from God. He will warn and advise His kids. If we don't learn to listen and understand when God is impressing something on and for us, then we will face further challenges in the future without His leading, as will most non-Christians.

I think that as with most things we can challenge ourselves to take baby steps in this direction if we are having problems with patience. While we are waiting for the things that bother us the most God is wanting us to grow stronger spiritually in our patience. Maybe while we are waiting in line at Walmart, we should pray for the clerk who is working hard to ring up the customers in front of us. We can look around and pray for an older person or challenged person or angry person standing in front, beside or behind us. We can pray for the people in the car ahead of us that we are not able yet to pass, etc. This is pleasing to God. Probably we all need to work on those things. I know I do.
