TODAY'S READING:

Let us prepare ourselves for the Word of God. Our hearts and minds are open and we are eager to hear.

A READING FROM GOD'S WORD: Phil. 2:1-10

"Therefore if there is any consolation in Christ, if any comfort of love, if any fellowship of the Spirit, if any affection and mercy, fulfill my joy by being like-minded, having the same love, being of one accord, of one mind. Let nothing be done through selfish ambition or conceit, but in lowliness of mind let each esteem others better than himself. Let each of you look out not only for his own interests but also for the interests of others.

Let this mind be in you which was also in Christ Jesus, who, being in the form of God, did not consider it robbery to be equal with God, but made Himself of no reputation, taking the form of a bondservant, and coming in the likeness of men. And being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself and became obedient to the point of death, even the death of the cross. Therefore God also has highly exalted Him and given Him the name which is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of those in heaven, and of those on earth, and of those under the earth."

MESSAGE:

THE FRUIT OF THE SPIRIT IS KINDNESS

"Loving-kindness has converted more sinners than either zeal, eloquence or learning."

Keith L. Brooks

Definition of kindness: Useful moral excellence of character or demeanor, gracious, gentle, a quality and characteristic of Jesus of being loving, friendly, generous, considerate, caring.

- Titus 3:4-5: But when the kindness and love of God our Savior appeared, he saved us, not because of righteous things we had done, but because of his mercy. He saved us through the washing of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit.
- Eph. 4:32 Be ye kind, one to another; tender-hearted, forgiving one another. Even as God, for Christ's sake has forgiven you.
- Acts 28:2: And the natives showed us unusual kindness; for they kindled a fire and made us all welcome, because of the rain that was falling and because of the cold.
- Acts 9:36: At Joppa there was a certain disciple named Tabitha, which is translated Dorcas. This woman was full of good works and charitable deeds which she did.
- Rom. 2:4: Or do you despise the riches of His goodness, forbearance, and longsuffering, not knowing that the goodness of God leads you to repentance?
- Col. 3:12: Therefore, as the elect of God, holy and beloved, put on tender mercies, kindness, humility, meekness, longsuffering;

Prov. 3:3: Let not mercy and truth forsake you; Bind them around your neck, Write them on the tablet of your heart,

Micah 5:8: But truly I am full of power by the Spirit of the LORD, And of justice and might, to declare to Jacob his transgression and to Israel his sin.

Phil. 2:4: Rejoice in the Lord always. Again I will say, rejoice!

I want to start off by saying that this characteristic of Jesus is one with which we definitely want to be identified. I think it is the byproduct of love. Someone said that faith is a fact and faith is an act. We act out God's love as we live out our lives. Brothers and sisters, we are the body of Christ. Jesus left us with the responsibility to be His hands and His feet and His mouth here on earth. He set the example that we're to follow.

Let me ask a question. How can we live as God wants us to live, how can we be pleasing to God, if we don't even know what He expects of us? We learn that from His Word to us, His children. People, I pray that we all are striving to be firmly established and grounded in the Word of God!

One of my very favorite Scriptures tells us exactly how Jesus feels about acting upon the spirit of kindness, and how it pleases Him. I want every one of us this morning who reads this, to grasp, grasp, fully grasp the significance of this Scripture. It is so easy and yet most people fail to see it. Many people in this world today are lovers of themselves. It's all about them. What's in it for me? I am not happy unless everything is going just right for me. I don't have to put up with that inconvenience. I don't have to help them. What have they ever done for me? And on and on, the big me -- little you.

We need to know this Scripture (Matthew 25:31-46) and live our lives daily, applying these following principles. I know that some of you do this.

"But when the son of man comes in His glory, and all the angels with Him, then He will sit on His Glorious Throne. And all the nations will be gathered before Him; and He will separate them from one another as the shepherd separates the sheep from the goats; and He will put the sheep on His right, and the goats on the left.

Then the king will say to those on His right, Come, you who are blessed of My Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world. For I was hungry, and you gave me something to eat; I was thirsty and you gave me, drink. I was a stranger, and you invited me in. I was naked and you clothed me. I was sick and you visited me, I was in prison and you came to me.

Then the righteous will answer Him, saying, Lord, when did we see You hungry, and feed You, or thirsty, and give You drink? And when did we see You a stranger and invite You in, or naked and clothed You, and see You sick, or in prison, and come to You?

And the king will answer and say to them, truly I say to you, when you did it to the least of these my brethren, then you did it to Me.

Then He will say to those on the left, depart from me accursed ones, into the eternal fire which has been prepared for the devil and His angels.

For I was hungry, and you gave me nothing to eat. I was thirsty and you gave me nothing to drink. I was a stranger and you didn't invite Me in; naked and you did not clothe Me; sick and in prison, and you did not visit Me.

Then they themselves will also answer, saying, Lord, when did we see You hungry, or thirsty, or a stranger, or naked or sick or in prison, and did not take care of You?

Then He will answer them saying, truly I say to you, to the extent that you did not do it to one of the least of these, you did not do it to Me.

And these will go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life."

Wow!! Is that not powerful? Is that not descriptive of what we need to do and to be for others? I don't want to be counted with the goats. Do you?

When I was a boy, I was hotly pursuing my Eagle Scout award. I loved everything about scouting from the camping out to the things we learned and accomplished with merit badges. Each level inspired me to continue on until at 16 I received my Eagle Scout and God and Country Awards.

Much of what Jesus is talking about in Matthew 25, I was taught in scouting. I remember one time on a camping trip we were in the woods working on merit badges, etc. Our assignment was to follow a trail that led us with Indian signs. In other words, there would be things like rocks together in a certain way that would be a directional sign. Also, sticks positioned in a special way meant something else. So, as we walked through the woods looking for the signs, we entered a clearing which led back to camp and there was one of our leaders gathering wood. As we approached, he was struggling with a pretty sizable log, which would be used for us to sit on around the council fire that night. He was trying to get it up on his shoulder. We stood there and finally one of the boys...not me... left the group and went over to help him carry it to the camp. That night at the council fire, he was called forward in front of the whole troop and given an award, for seeing someone in need and helping him. It was all set up as a test. One boy passed. Our Boy Scout slogan was to "do a good turn daily".

So, let's think about this. Jesus said clearly, when we do it for one of the least of these, it's the same as if we were doing it for Him. So, you mean that if we drive to Springfield to the hospital to visit someone from our church or neighborhood, it's the same as if Jesus was there and we went to visit Him? That's exactly what it says to me. Let's say we visit someone in a nursing home Do you know, before COVID 19 that you could go into most any nursing home and ask the director for the name of someone who is not being visited by anyone, and then visit them? Maybe share the Lord with them. Maybe read them Scripture, or pray with them. Maybe just draw them out to share with you things that were important to them in their lives. They've done studies of the elderly and asked them what was important at this moment in their lives. Number one on the list was for someone to listen to them.

To carry it further, every day, if we look around, being sensitive to someone who needs something, whatever it is and however we can help them, and we do it, it's the same as if we were doing it for Jesus.

Let's say you're sitting in a restaurant eating lunch and you see out the window a car pull into the parking area. You watch as an elderly man or woman begin the process of pushing their door open, gathering up their walker, and with difficulty setting it out and then limp up to the door. Why not anticipate their difficulty getting the door open, moving through it to the inside door

and going through that again. Then standing in line waiting to order. If we are sensitive to the needs of others we would be at the door to help them and even placing their order for them while they take a seat. This is just one small example. There are thousands of needs out there waiting for an act of kindness, no matter how small. We are doing it for that person and for Jesus. We need to get out of ourselves and watch and anticipate the needs of others.

After COVID19, let's go visit someone in the hospital, let's go to the nursing home, let's let another person in line, smile, wave, say a kind word, do acts of kindness every day. "Do unto others as you would have them do unto you." Let's sow seeds of kindness every day and Jesus will notice them all...and He will be pleased.

We need to devote ourselves to looking for ways to do good every day.
